A Message From Our Executive Director

One year ago, we set an ambitious and strategic course to fund healthier communities across the Brightli system of providers through a targeted Foundation expansion. FY24 set the bar, FY25 raised it.

- 4x more contributions than FY24—a record-breaking leap in support!
- 280 new donors—our community is growing stronger than ever.
- 60% increase in average grant size amplifying impact where it's needed most.
- 58% increase in employee giving participation our team is all in for the mission.
- 38% increase in Brightli Gives revenue meaning more clients impacted than ever before.
- 2 new powerhouse fundraising teams launched in Springfield and St. Louis, MO.
- 10 staff now champion our mission—an 8-person expansion for mission scale-up.
- 7 provider organizations across five states now receive our philanthropic support.
- · Intentional investment in infrastructure to fuel future growth and mission expansion!

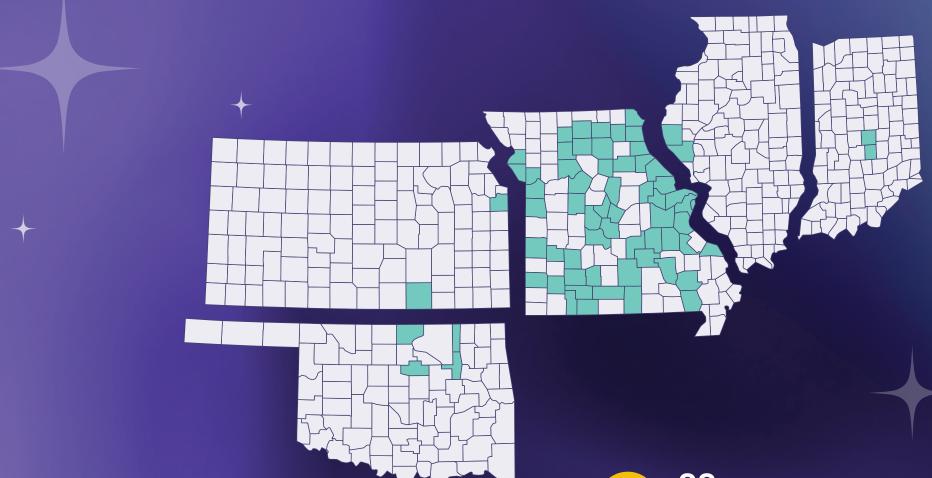
How We Operate

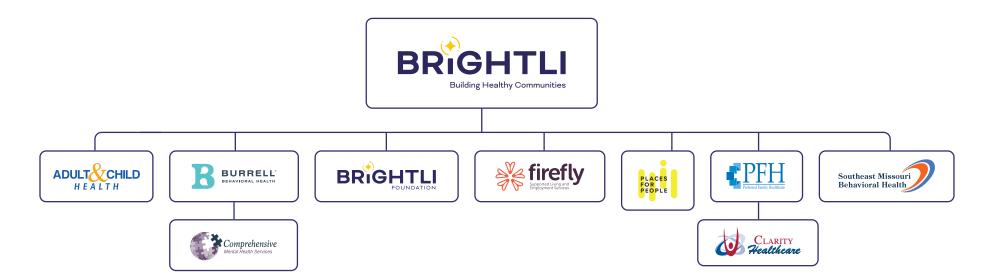

Impact Made Possible By Employee Champions

Youth SUD Program Spaces

Brightli Foundation was able to enhance a youth substance use disorder (SUD) program by creating engaging, welcoming, and therapeutic spaces that promote healing and growth. This project included reading nook enhancements, client room enhancements, sensory room development, outdoor recreation equipment, and more purchased to meet the unique needs of youth navigating SUD challenges. (BBH, Kansas City Region)

Supportive Recovery Projects

Blessing bags, a recovery garden, Recover workbooks, and a sensory room were all made possible to support clients in recovery. Blessing bags allow staff to give clients that carry around their belongings in trash bags an option to receive a stronger reusable backpack or drawstring bag. The recovery garden gives adolescents in recovery a healthy new hobby. The Recover workbooks are useful tools for group sessions and the sensory room will support development for clients in residential. (North Central Region)

RecoverED

Brightli Foundation supported RecoverED, a program offering eating disorder treatment in a region and state where such services are rare. Through funding a new therapeutic garden, which addresses food insecurity, clients rebuild a healthy relationship with food by growing it themselves—fostering both nourishment, nutrition education, and joy. (BBH, Southwest Region)

Leaders In Training

In efforts to empower middle school students against drugs and violence, Brightli Foundation sponsored a Leaders in Training summit. By investing in prevention for youth early on, we know it will help them make more informed decisions as they grow that can impact the trajectory of their life. (PFH, Greater St. Louis Region)







Impact Made Possible By Community Champions

EMDR Tool Kits

To support trauma recovery, Brightli Foundation equipped clinicians trained in EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing) with tool kits, allowing them to bring this powerful therapy to clients wherever they are. Each kit includes a light bar, remote, tactile buzzers, headphones, and a tripod, all in a portable case. It allows clinicians to customize treatment for a wide variety of disorders, including but not limited to disorders that have a hard time making progress with other types of modalities. (BBH, Southwest Region)

IMPART

The IMPART Program is a powerful initiative that keeps mothers and infants together during treatment. It provides both inpatient and outpatient services for pregnant women and new mothers, including parenting education and support for babies born with substance exposure. The goal is to reduce out-of-home placements, improve the health of moms and their babies, and strengthen family bonds. (BBH, Southwest Region)

School-based Summer Therapy Programs

Recognizing the gap in care during school breaks, Brightli Foundation also funds school-based summer therapy programs. These include summer camps and mailed therapy kits for children who receive mental health services during the school year but may lose access over the summer. This ensures continuity of care for vulnerable youth. (North Central Region & Southwest Region)

Partner Impact & Highlights

OPR (Question, Persuade, and Refer) Trainings

QPR training has been funded with support from the Kansas City Royals Foundation and is vital because it equips individuals with the skills to recognize the warning signs of suicide and take immediate, potentially lifesaving action. By investing in this evidence-based program, communities can build a network of informed gatekeepers who help reduce stigma and connect people in crisis to the support they need. It ultimately strengthens mental health resilience and saves lives. (CMHS, Kansas City Region)

The Nature Therapy Program

This year we grew the Nature Therapy Program, developed in partnership with grant funders, Bass Pro Foundation and Community Foundation of the Ozarks, and program partner, 37 North Expeditions. This program augments traditional therapies, offering clients healing experiences in nature—like hiking, fishing, and other group activities that build connection and resiliency—while also providing essentials such as food, backpacks, and gear. Funding The Future

We started a few things in FY25 to strategically plan for the future. Behavioral health needs don't stop. So neither do we.

Brightli Foundation looks forward to seeing these projects and many more come to life in FY26. Stay tuned for more updates on how our supporters are helping us fund the future of mental health!

School-Based Services Lego Office Project

A majority of schools in the Southwest region of Missouri are facing space constraints and are unable to provide on-site mental health services, resulting in higher levels of unmet mental health care needs and additional barriers to care. By funding and placing six Lego Offices in five schools in the Southwest region in FY26, School-Based Services (SBS) clinicians from Burrell Behavioral Healthcare will be able to serve 30–40 additional elementary and middle school students per month on average.

Dental Care

Firefly clients with developmental disabilities face multiple access barriers to dental care that can lead to higher rates of untreated caries (cavities) and periodontal disease. Thanks to grant partner, Delta Dental of Missouri, we are able to reduce those barriers to care in FY26 and provide the support necessary to improve and maintain optimal oral health outcomes. Clients are able to say goodbye to pain, discomfort, and limiting their diet, and hello to a new sense of confidence.

Youth Resiliency Campus

We're currently involved in funding the future Burrell Behavioral Health Youth Resiliency Campus, a convenient one-stop-shop for child and youth services across all levels of care in Springfield, Missouri. This is largely thanks to a grant received by The Bobby Allison Fund. The campus will include a new 24/7 Youth Behavioral Crisis Center (the first in Missouri), a youth residential treatment center, and more. It will offer immediate treatment and hope to families in crisis as well as connection to the ongoing care they need by 2026.
